Passing of Dr. Elwood strikes SUAF chord

The passing of Dr. **Douglas Elwood** Dec. 31 was felt hard by alumni who knew him and his family during his service years at Silliman. For San Diego Sillimanians, it struck a special chord. The series *American Missionaries* by previous chapter vice-president **Ligaya Magbanua Simpkins** and published in *PortalXtra* issues last year featured the Elwood family (May 2012). As such, readers of the newsletter were given a flashback to the contributions of Dr. Elwood to Silliman life and community.

In a short sermon Dr. Elwood gave ("Death as Life's Final Fulfillment"), he said: "One who has lived his/her life in self-giving service for others can, like Christ, anticipate his own death... My death is the fulfillment of my life and my last great achievement. It is the last important decision I can make, and it is the best thing I can do, for no man has any greater love than this."

Son Chris, during funeral services, spoke of his father: "He wants more than anything, for us to live a life of purpose, overflowing with abundance and fulfillment ... like he did".

San Diego alumni feel we know Dr. Elwood and the life he led much, much better.
